Key Points on Dominion from Genesis 1:26:

- **Divine Origin:** Dominion is not granted by government or kings, but by God directly to man at creation.
- **Inherent Authority:** It affirms that mankind was **given** sovereign stewardship — not ownership, but responsibility — over all creation.
- **Legal Standing:** In equity and natural law, this verse is often cited to affirm that man stands above corporate fictions (citizens, persons, trusts) and does not need permission to govern his affairs.
- **Trust Implication:** It forms the original trust relationship — God (Grantor) Man (Trustee & Beneficiary) Creation (Res).



Equitable Interpretation:

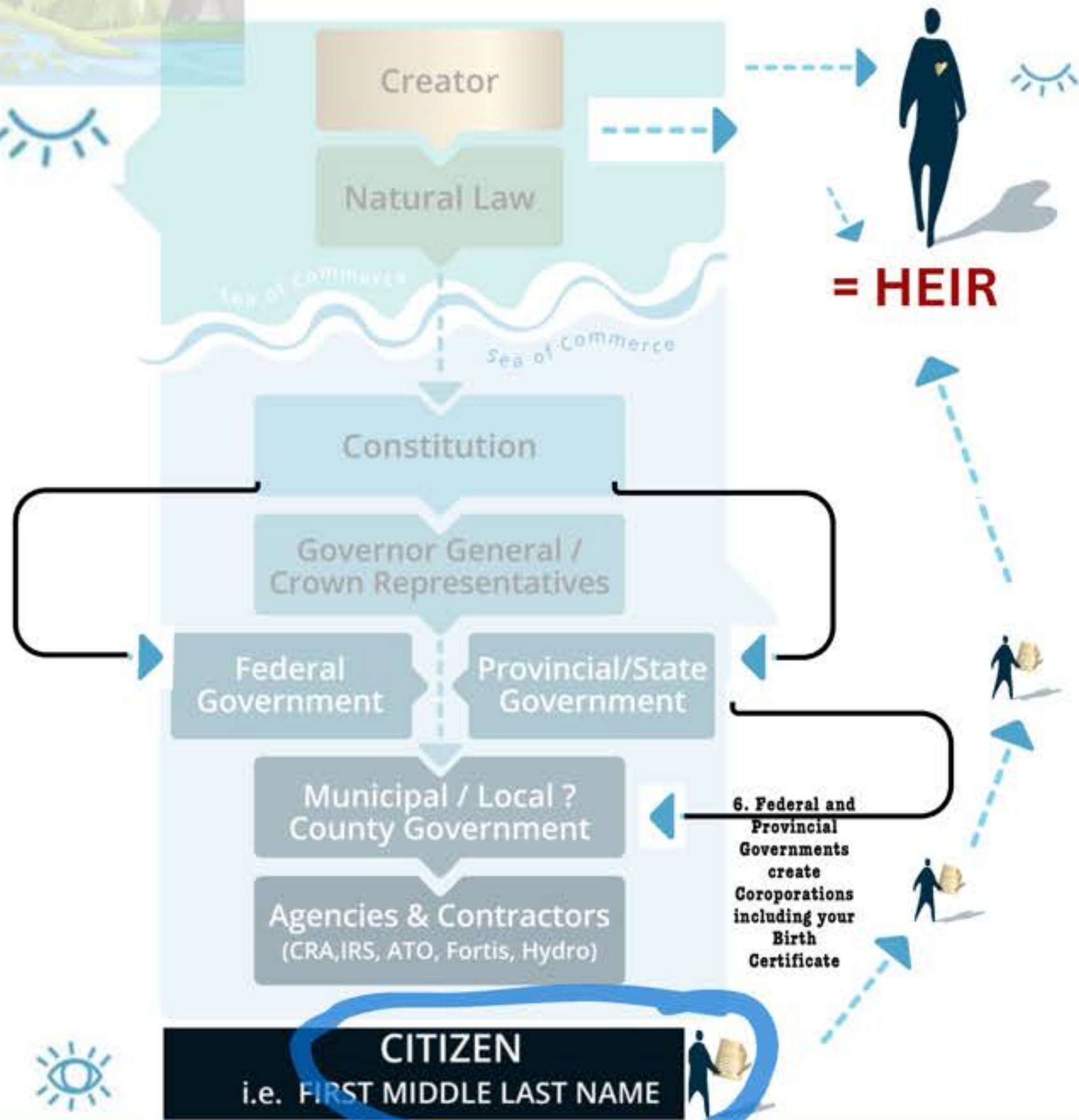
- Dominion, from an equity perspective, means lawful stewardship of the res (property or estate) — a role that cannot be stripped unless man abandons it or contracts it away.

Black’s Law Dictionary (11th ed.):

- “Dominion: Control; ownership; the right to govern or rule; supreme authority.” - Especially as applied to property, dominion implies full control and power of disposition.

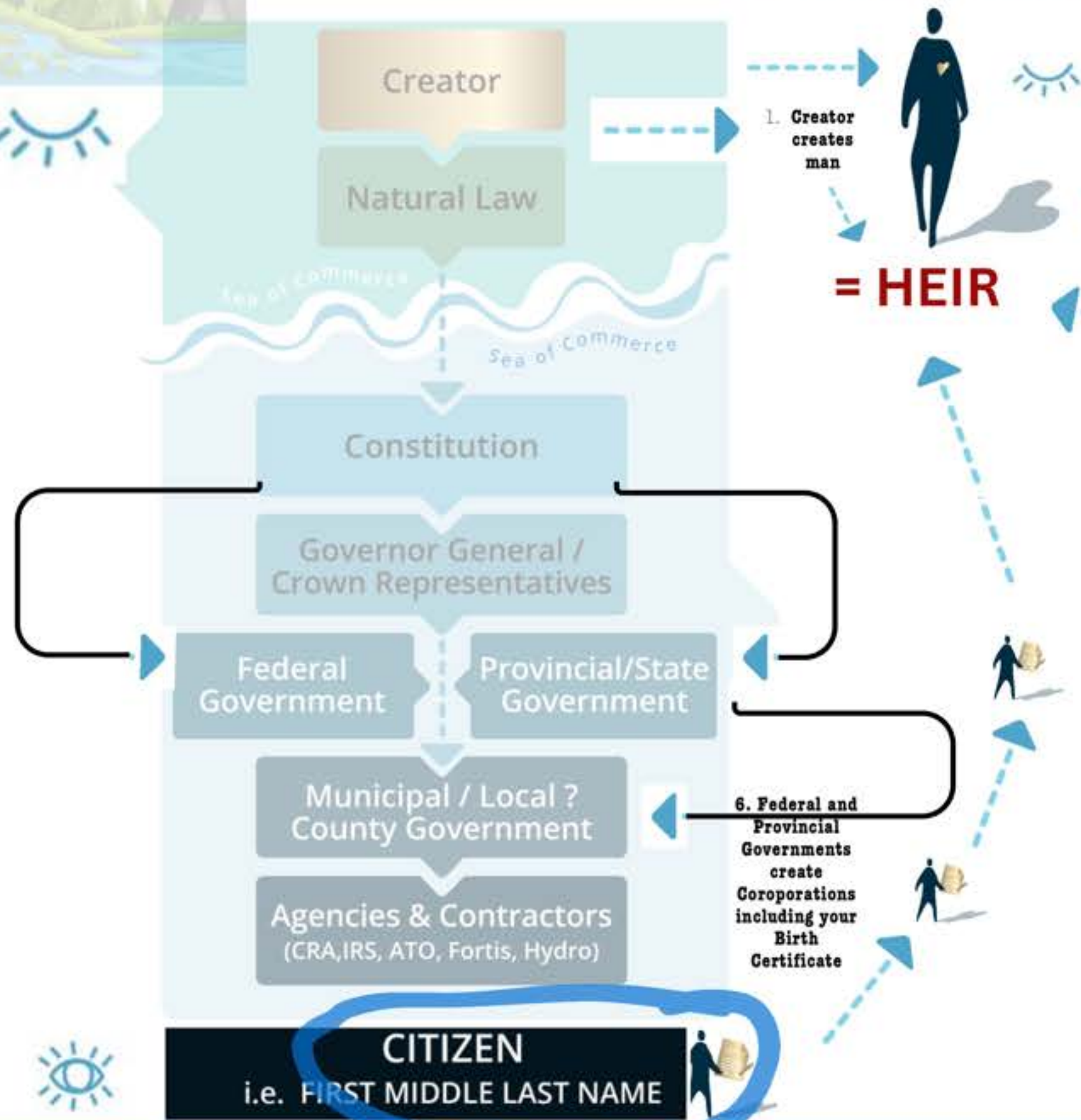

Law Is the Foundation of Everything

Law — in its purest form — is **the invisible order behind all of creation**. From the divine laws that govern life, free will, and consequence, to the natural laws that regulate the universe, and finally the legal systems that govern human interaction — **law is what gives form, structure, and accountability to existence itself**. **Without law, there is only chaos**. Every breath you take, every contract you sign, every relationship you hold, and every boundary you protect rests upon some form of law — divine, natural, or man-made. Understanding law is not just about defending your rights; it is about remembering your place as a conscious being with authority, stewardship, and responsibility under the Creator's order. When you align yourself with the right laws — beginning with Natural and Equity — you no longer live by fear, but by knowing. **Law is not just a system — it is the sacred framework of life itself**.

Who created what and who controls what and who?



Romans 8:17

“And if children, then heirs—heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ...”

Equity sees man as an inheritor, not a subject or debtor.

Galatians 4:7

“Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.”

Equity recognizes status and standing — not form — and upholds the heir’s interest.

Summary for Your Integration:

A man is heir by right of creation. He does not need permission to exist or govern.

Maxims of equity, when interpreted through the lens of divine law, affirm that the created (man) inherits the purpose, dominion, and estate of the Creator’s intent — **unless he abandons it.**

But from the moment we are born, systems of commerce and governance begin recording, labeling, and categorizing us into artificial structures.

In this program we have been walking through the innerstanding of how we became part of a public trust system—and how, through lawful declaration and attainment of majority, we can begin to journey into our natural standing as a private man or woman.

This is the foundation of your **capacity**.

"**Capacity** in equity is the ability of a man or woman to hold and enforce equitable rights and duties in conscience, to act as trustee, grantor, or beneficiary, and to appear in one's true character, not merely as a legal fiction."

Equity sees that as done which ought to be done.

Your status is presumed until you declare it. The moment you declare your majority and status, the equitable trust shifts





Every man and woman comes into this world with inalienable rights, endowed by their Creator.

"Where there is a right, there is a remedy." — Maxim of Equity

This ancient principle means:

If you truly have a right, the law (specifically equity) must provide you with a way to protect or restore it. A right without a remedy is no right at all.

What does this mean in simple terms?

Let's say you have a right to your name, or a right to not be taxed without consent, or a right to private property.

If say, a government agency or bank violates that right, equity says there must be a path to make it right.

Without a path to remedy, you're left powerless. But equity ensures you are not left powerless—if you know how to assert your right properly.

Real-Life Example:

Let's say the government registered your birth and created a legal fiction in all caps. You were never told that this created obligations and liabilities.

Now you want to stand as the living man or woman and claim your property and rights.

Under equity:

- You can declare your status.
- You can notify them of the error or presumption.
- You can claim your interest and demand correction.

That is a remedy.

And the right is your dominion, your private capacity, your heirship.

Every man and woman comes into this world with inalienable rights, endowed by their Creator.

Refers to natural, God-given rights that are inherent, untransferable, and non-negotiable—they cannot be rightfully taken away, because they originate from a higher source than any man-made law or government.

These inalienable rights include:

1. The Right to Life

You have the right to live and exist. No authority can lawfully deprive you of your life without due process.

Scripture Basis: Genesis 2:7 – "And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life..."

Equity Principle: Equity acts in personam – equity protects the life, dignity, and personhood of man and woman.

2. The Right to Liberty (Freedom of Choice and Movement)

You are free to think, speak, worship, move, and live your life according to your conscience, provided you do not harm others.

Scripture Basis: Galatians 5:1 – "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free..."

Maxim of Equity: Equity will not suffer a wrong without a remedy.

Your liberty cannot be infringed without lawful remedy being available.

3. The Right to Property and Stewardship

You are entrusted with property—your body, your labor, your creations, and your resources. These belong to you as the lawful steward under Creator.

Scripture Basis: Genesis 1:28 – "...have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth."

Equity Trust Structure:

God is Grantor, Man is Trustee, Earth is Res.

You are accountable for how you manage creation, including your own estate.

4. The Right to Contract and Association

You have the freewill to enter into agreements, to associate or disassociate, and to govern your affairs in peace, so long as you do no harm.

Equity Principle: He who seeks equity must do equity.

With freedom to contract comes duty to act honorably and justly in all dealings.

5. The Right to Due Process and Remedy

No man or entity can impose harm, obligation, or judgment upon you without proper notice, opportunity to respond, and a lawful hearing.

Common Law Right: Audi alteram partem – "Hear the other side."

Maxim: Ubi jus ibi remedium – "Where there is a right, there is a remedy."

Why This Matters:

These rights are not granted by governments—they are recognized by just systems of law. Governments that operate in equity and justice must presume your rights unless you waive or forfeit them by consent or dishonor.

While every man and woman is born with divine, unalienable rights—such as life, liberty, and property—the moment we enter into commerce, we choose to operate within a system of contracts and obligations. Commerce is governed not by divine law, but by man-made rules, like statutory law, law merchant, and trust law.

That means:

- Your rights remain, but to access commercial benefits (like banking, licenses, healthcare, travel), you must use a legal name, sign contracts, and often accept liabilities.
- In doing so, you enter the public domain, where presumptions apply unless you rebut them.
- Therefore, to preserve your rights in commerce, you must operate as a conscious trustee or creditor, not as an unaware debtor or corporate citizen.
- This is why status correction, declarations, and trust structuring are essential—for asserting your private rights while engaging commercially with honor.

Core Concepts

1. Purpose of the Age of Majority (AOM):

- **The purpose of declaring your Age of Majority is to formally and lawfully rebut the presumption of minority, which is the legal assumption that you are still a dependent or a ward under state guardianship.**

Why this matters: **Rebut Presumptions of Incapacity**

- By default, the government presumes you are legally incompetent (a minor or ward) unless you declare otherwise.
- Replaces the presumption of guardianship with a presumption of capacity.
- Asserts you can handle your own affairs—status, property, and obligation.

2, **Purpose of a Declaration of Status** is to formally and lawfully assert who you are — outside the presumptions of government, statutes, or commercial law.

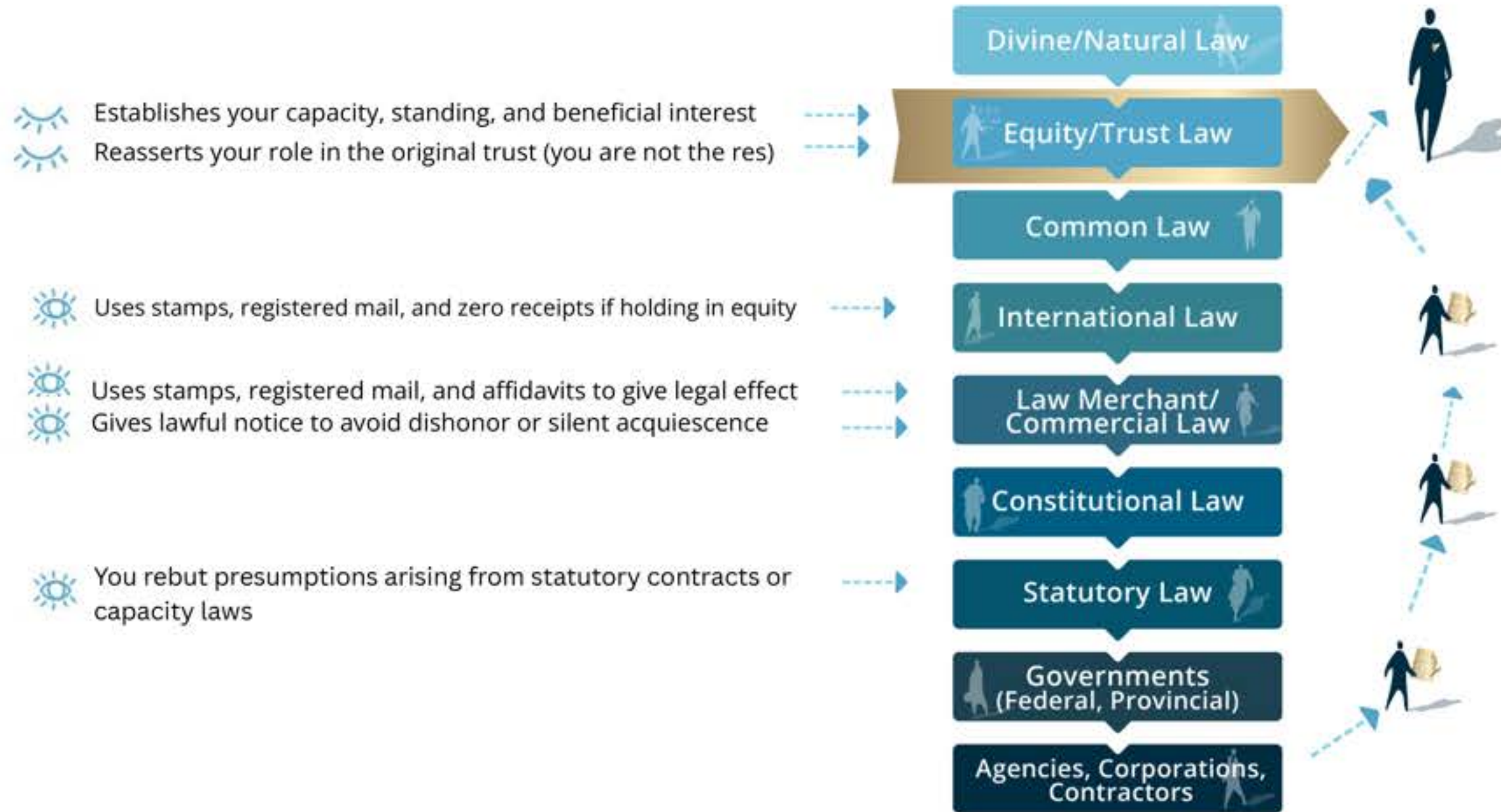
Why this matters: **It is your private proclamation to the PUBLIC | STATE that:**

- **You are a living man or woman**, not a corporate/legal fiction (i.e., not the ALL-CAPS name).
- **You are the beneficiary** of any trust or estate created in your name — not the trustee or surety.
- **You stand in equity and honor**, not in submission to administrative presumptions.
